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## Observations and Recommendations during Second Cycle: 2011

- i. Establishment of USIC, CIC, Alumni Association, Student Chapters of Professional Bodies, Clubs
- ii. Establishment of College Development Council
- iii. Collaborations with National and International institutions for research development
- iv. Interdepartmental/inter-disciplinary research
- v. Consultancy to industries and establishment of Entrepreneurship Development
- vi. Resource Mobilization
- vii. Filling vacant teaching posts and adequate salary to SFS staff
- viii. Introduction of new programmes to meet regional local needs
- ix. Wi-fi campus development
- x. Sustainable Development through alternate energy use, rain water harvesting, organic farming and land use planning

It was discussed by all members that most of the recommendations made during second cycle have been implemented. The following recommendations were discussed and decisions were taken as below:

- Hon'ble Vice Chancellor advised the Dean, Students Welfare to take necessary steps to initiate Students Chapters of Professional Bodies of academic, literary and cultural associations on the campus.
- ii. The Hon'ble Chairman also emphasized that concerned departments and institutes must take necessary steps to avail benefits of MOUs entered into with various regional and national institutions for faculty exchange, student exchange and collaborative research collaborations.
- iii. It was also discussed and resolved that an Entrepreneurship Development Cell shall be constituted to initiate university industry collaborations and inculcate entrepreneurship skills amongst students of various professional courses. The proposal may be put before the forthcoming meeting of Executive Council for approval.
- iv. As per the recommendation of the NAAC Peer Team, Hon'ble Chairman of the meeting advised the present Deans and HODs to encourage the faculty for interdisciplinary research projects and broaden the research base.
- v. It was also discussed and resolved that to ensure contribution of the University in regional development by ensuring employability of the youth, new interdisciplinary technical and vocational courses at certificate and diploma

levels be introduced on campus as per the availability of infrastructure and faculty members.

- vi. Regarding the recommendation for wi-fi campus, it was discussed and resolved that most of the institute of the campus are covered under wi-fi facility.
- vii. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Chairman of the meeting also expressed his concern on use of alternate energy as recommended by NAAC Peer team. It was resolved that necessary steps shall be initiated to for the provision of Solar Energy on campus.
- viii. Also regarding sustainable development and conservation of environment the university shall ensure waste recycling, water treatment plant, sewage treatment plant and rain water harvesting. The Institute of Environment and Development Studies agreed to extend all possible support. The Institute of Agriculture Sciences assured to introduce and implement organic farming and land use management.

It was agreed unanimously that efforts shall be made to ensure implementation of all the recommendations of the Peer Team. It was discussed that the next meeting shall focus on the recommendations of the peer team during its visit during third cycle in 2017.

The meeting ended with the vote of thanks to the Chair.
